MBC-A Passes State of Michigan Audit!!

MBC-A is licensed by the Michigan Gaming Commission to manage poker nights at various bowling alleys and American Legion halls. We earn much of our operating funds from these long, but fun weekends. We generally operate two events a year out of a maximum 4 allowed by the state, as it is hard to find volunteers during the spring/summer/fall when MBC members are busy with the boating season.

The Michigan Gaming Control Board requires that all funds earned through the poker nights be deposited into a separate checking account, and these funds can only be spent and used for purposes directly related to the mission statement of MBC-A.

At the end of December, we were selected for an audit of our Charitable Gaming Account including every check written, supporting receipts and every page of reporting documentation for each day of the poker events during 2023. Mr. Bill Grefka, Regulation Officer with the Licensing & Investigation Section of the Michigan Gaming Control Board inspected the MBC-A accounts for nearly a month, concluding the audit on Jan 30, 2024.

MBC-A is happy to report to the Monroe Boat Club membership that Mr. Grefka was pleased with the accounting practices of MBC-Association, all of our licenses are in good standing and we are continuing to utilize the Michigan Charitable Gaming system for producing revenue.

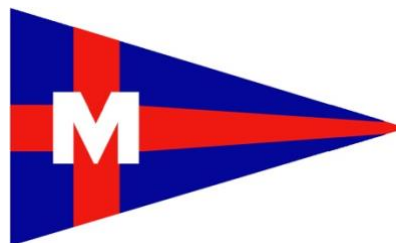
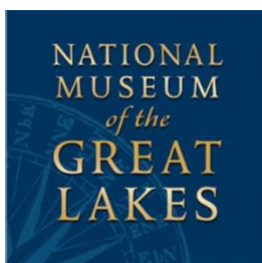

Shrink Wrap Recycling

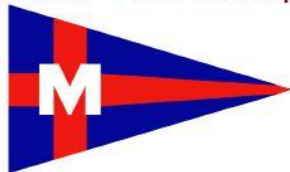
!!2024 Boat Shrink Wrap Recycling!!

All shrink wrap from the MBC Storage Yard must be recycled into the special Michigan Recycling Bags - or removed by the boat owner.

No plastic disposal dumpster will be provided by Monroe Boat Club.

Recycle Bags are available from the MBC Bar for \$10.00 from April to June.

Deliver full bags *BEFORE* June 10 to the Monroe Boat Club collection point.



WHY RECYCLE BOAT COVERS?

- Protects the Great Lakes by keeping them clean and waste-free.
- Looks great on a Clean Marina application or recertification.
- Fuels the circular economy in Michigan! Recycled plastics are used to create new products here in the U.S.
- For every bag recycled, we save:
 - 115 kWh of energy

HOW TO PREPARE BOAT SHRINK WRAP FOR RECYCLING:



STEP ONE:
Cut the shrink wrap just above the perimeter band, going around the entire boat.



STEP TWO:
After removing all vents, zipper doors, strapping, and buckles, begin removing your shrink wrap cover. Try to keep the shrink wrap as clean as possible.



STEP THREE:
Stuff your EZ-Fill Bag with your boat wrap. If storing outside, turn sealed bag upside down until pickup and do not overstuff bags - make sure to use supplied closure device to seal the bag.

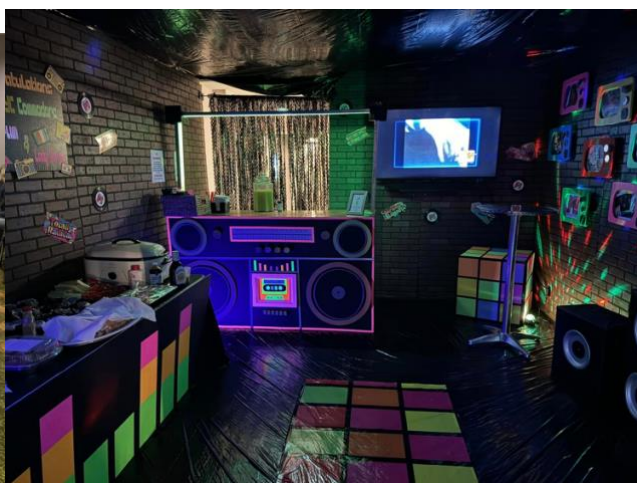
